Committee Reports

Business Growth & Development

(Steve Bumbera, Chair)

A small group with some new faces met on January 19th for the Business Growth & Development Committee meeting. After some discussion on the various Business After Hours events that are scheduled throughout the year, the committee took on the task of developing a series of seminars that have been under discussion in recent months focusing on customer service training. The MODC Cultural & Tourism Committee has been discussing the same issue, and is prepared to partner with this group to create a number of programs that would be geared to both the philosophical aspects of customer service for business owners and management, as well as the actual employee training component itself. Some of the modules that are part of the New Jersey Department of Labor's Human Resource Training programs can be integrated into this effort, and the tourism representatives have contacts with potential speakers that will address the issue of elevating the importance of good service in order to be successful in business. These workshops will coincide with the April luncheon program whose program will include a discussion on customer service in New Jersey. This committee will be assisting in securing a program for the June luncheon, and has begun to reach out to potential speakers for that event. The next committee meeting will be on February 16th.

Cultural & Tourism (Mike Redpath, Chair)

The frigid temperature on January 18th was a stark reminder that winter is still with us, but the Cultural & Tourism Committee members were thinking spring as they met for their monthly meeting. Mike Redpath updated the committee on the Governor's Conference on Tourism, which is going to be presented in conjunction with the Summit at the Shore event in Atlantic City in April. This committee is hosting the April luncheon program, which will feature Curtis Bashaw, Executive Director of the Casino Reinvestment Development Authority (CRDA), who is also the host for the Summits that have been taking place. The MODC luncheon could serve as a good time to market the tourism conference and the summit events the following week. The committee is also still in planning stages of putting together a customer service oriented training workshop, which might coincide with the April luncheon. Speakers and topics are still being secured, and more details will be available by the next meeting. Some of the other projects on the table with this committee, such as the data partnership with Monmouth University and the public education project on beach and water quality in our region, are in progress and will continue to be a focus for the upcoming months. The next meeting is scheduled for February 15th at the MODC office.

Economic Development

(Steve Juliano, Chair)

The December 17th meeting of the Economic Development Committee was typical in that there was a full table of committee members in attendance, and they tackled a large agenda of issues. In the absence of Bonnie Goldschlag, Ben Waldron commented on a recent meeting between members of the MOM coalition in Monmouth and Ocean Counties, and the Commissioner of the NJ Department of Transportation and a number of representatives of New Jersey Transit. Although there was no specific agenda for the meeting, it appears that NJDOT and NJ Transit are supportive of the fact that a preferred alignment is necessary to be released from the DEIS that is currently underway. There was some discussion regarding legislative changes that are being considered for the recently enacted fast track bills . Members of the committee seemed in agreement that a total repeal of the bills was not appropriate, but that modifications could address some of the concerns being expressed by environmental factions. An ongoing agenda item is the status of BRAC in New Jersey, and it was noted that there still has been no public release of the findings of the commission that was created by former Governor McGreevey to coordinate a statewide support effort to retain our military installations. MODC will try to reach out to other government agencies that are involved in the BRAC discussions to see if any information is available. This committee will be hosting the February luncheon, and Caren Franzini, CEO of the NJ Economic Development Authority will be the guest speaker. They are also still looking to host a luncheon and conference in the Spring and will be looking for appropriate speakers and programs to incorporate into that event. The next committee meeting will take place on January 28th at New Jersey Natural Gas Company.

Nonprofit

(Tony Chiariello, Chair)

Despite a wet and dreary morning, members of MODC's Nonprofit Committee turned out in volume once again, as they met at the offices of the Visiting Nurse Association of Central Jersey in Red Bank. Our gracious host, CEO Lucille Richards, not only provided a hospitable meeting location, but also a healthy breakfast and an educational presentation on the great things that the VNA has accomplished in recent months. With nearly 1,000 people working at varying capacities of care giving, VNACJ is bringing a number of healthcare initiatives to the local communities, including a premier hospice program, a pet therapy and music therapy initiative, and the distribution of thousands of flu vaccines. A special thanks to the VNA for sharing their facility and their story with our committee. Tony Chiariello updated the committee on his meeting with John McIlquham who will be the guest speaker for the January 26th lecture series. Tony assured the group that Mr. McIlquham is a vibrant and passionate speaker, and should provide

which is being hosted by this committee. The guest speaker will be a



representative from Lehman Brothers, where they have set up a Philanthropy Committee to provide an outlet for their employees to interact with the nonprofit community in a variety of ways. The next meeting is set for February 24th at a location to be determined.

Technology (Bill Eventoff, Chair)

The first dusting of snow for the new year was not enough to keep a full table of Technology Committee members from their meeting on January 17th. With just a few weeks left before the seminar which they have planned, last minute details of the program consumed the first portion of the agenda. Committee members will be making a final push for registrations over the next two weeks to assure a good turn out for the February 2nd event. A meeting date has finally been set for the ad hoc committee that will be discussing the possibility of starting an internship program in Monmouth & Ocean Counties. The first order of business will be to determine the program s structure and also the operating procedures that the educational institutions and MODC will function under. Once agreement is reached to proceed, MODC will be promoting the program through the membership and looking for businesses that would be willing to receive interns at their workplaces. Larry Mandel noted that there has been no further movement on legislation that would create a Foundation For Technology Advancement, however, the bill's sponsor will keep us informed on any progress and of scheduled hearings on the bill. Ben Waldron commented on the current status of BRAC, and also that a focus group working under the direction of Monmouth University is looking at the possibility of establishing a technology incubator Monmouth County. MODC will provide documentation on the feasibility study that was done back in 2001 on this subject and be part of the focus group going forward. The next committee meeting will be on February 28th.




